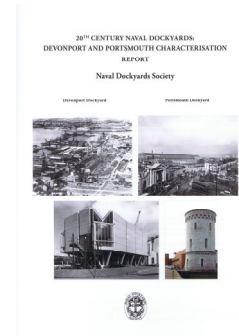

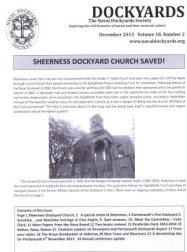

Sheerness Dockyard: Officers' houses saved


An eight-year campaign by the Naval Dockyards Society and other local, national and international heritage groups to prevent an unacceptable development of the officers' houses in Sheerness Dockyard was concluded in May 2011. After two planning applications by developer George Demetriou were rejected, Spitalfields Historic Buildings Trust (helped by an Architectural Heritage Fund loan) purchased the estate (on the English Heritage At Risk Register) for £1.85m. This complete 1820s naval officers' residential quarter of six Grade II* and four Grade II buildings is set in four acres of land. Regency Terrace (a row of five elegant houses) and the magnificent Dockyard House, built for the Chief Superintendent of the yard, have been refurbished by the Trust. The investors are restoring the properties as single homes, the conservation outcome desired by the cross-community amenity groups which had opposed the developer's plans since Swale Borough Council allowed him to buy the estate for £350K in 2003.
